When we provide training, there is usual a wide range of a priori knowledge across the participants. How to handle this so that each participant take the most out of the course?

Expandable index/frames

Would it be possible to create many pages inside a topic and organize them into a expandable index (not displayed at all times but not one page at a time).

Jupyter notebook automatic grading

I am interested to know if having the automatic grading in Jupyter notebooks would help in an unsupervised class/course.

Linked section

Is it possible to link to specific part of a page or topic? I want to refer to concrete lecture videos and theory in the feedback.

Fairly manage participants from different origins

We have participants from many different research centers in Germany and we want to distribute our efforts fairly across these centers. However communication delays and varied communication routes create an imbalance in the time frame, people have to register. Which methods can be used to alleviate this?

Pace of the course

How long should the student stay on individual page? Should content be split up a lot, e. g. to contain only a single message, or is it ok if more content is on one page? Is this important in keeping the students' attention?

Jupyter notebook on running X-ray Telescope simulations

I've used Mads' McStas Script in a vidoe as part of an interview to show how to run Jupyter based X-ray simulations of telescopes.

Question: I'm not certain that the video encourages tinkering/fiddling with the notebook. How can you formulate the thing such that students end of up active instead of just clicking next next?

In Coursera or Eudacity, some courses have quick questions in the middle of video lectures to review concepts just presented – how can we do this (if at all) in Moodle?

I had trouble organizing the course the exact way I wanted, needing to create long pages. So, I want to have different perspectives on how straightforward it looks.

Online course duration?

How do you (correctly) assess the duration it will take the students to complete the course?

I'd like to make a course which lasts around 45-60 min.

I have encountered several questions about the usage of external material in the courses:

- how to include it? Link, embedding, only a figure?
- how much is too much? What if only quizzes are made from scratch?
- how to reference such material? Each time it appears, at the end of the course, in the beginning?
